Dear Parents and visitors to our website,

As I hope you have noticed the School Development Plan is now featured in the parent section of the website. Hopefully if you have had time to go through it you will have noted the change to the new English Curriculum and the commitment to continued professional development for our staff. In line with this the staff are now well into an online training course (with certification) on Assessment for Learning which is the foundation of the new curriculum. The underlying principles they have been studying are as follows.....

Assessment as part of classroom activities is a fundamental process required to promote learning and ultimately achievement.

Learners need to know and understand the following before learning can take place:

- What is the aim of the learning ?
- Why do they need to learn it ?
- Where are they in terms of achieving the aim ?
- How can they achieve the aim ?

When learners know and understand these principles, the quality of learning will improve. Sharing this information with learners will promote ownership of the learning aims and a sense of shared responsibility between the teacher and learner to achieve those aims. Improving learners' confidence and self-esteem reflects positively in learners' work and their motivation is improved. To promote effective assessment, teachers need to:

- explain the learning aims to learners and check their understanding
- demonstrate the standards learners are required to achieve and help them recognise when they have

achieved that standard

- give effective feedback on assessment decisions, so that learners know how to improve
- demonstrate high expectations and make it obvious to learners that they believe that they can improve on their past performance
- provide regular opportunities for teachers and learners to reflect on the last performance and review learners' progress
- develop learners' self-assessment skills, so that they can recognise what aspects of their own work need to improve.

This week I had asked Mr. Graham and Miss Ewa to provide comments about activities in English and Polish classes and here is what they wrote:

This term, the year 7 English class has been looking at the History of English from the Anglo-Saxons to modern changes in English brought about by the internet and social media. We're now going back to consider each period in more detail, looking at the epic journey of heroes in Anglo-Saxon stories through a modern adaptation (Shrek) and some of the fables told by Chaucer in the Canterbury Tales.

The year 8 English class has been studying the Boy in the Striped Pyjamas this term, looking at the themes of fear and status alongside the effect of having a nine year old boy tell the story from his perspective. As we finish the book, the group will look at differences in the film adaptation and consider instances of prejudice that still exist today.

They year 9 English class has been analysing film in detail and the role non-literary features have in telling the story. This week, the class created their own stills adapting scenes from Orwell's Animal Farm and considering all the elements of mise en scène. Thank you to Foundation for lending us some of your small world equipment for our film-making!

This week, the year 8/9 Polish class is preparing for cooking lessons with Theo's grandma next week as the special guest. They will be learning names of the kitchen appliances and all the action verbs connected with cooking. We all cannot wait to try the Quiche Lorraine and Dongmin's Korean noodles!


We drove to our destination in a taxi and we got there about twenty minutes. We gave the people in the shelter our goods and took some pictures.





