Dear Parents,

Poland has a very strong cinematic tradition and it remains a vibrant part of artistic and cultural life. During Communism the cinema was often a form of expression that skilfully managed to communicate Poland's true spirit while limiting the intervention of the censor. In the first decade following the fall of communism there was the inevitable rush to embrace the glamour of Hollywood and the allure of western blockbusters and there was a fear, at the time, that Polish film would perish in the survival of the fittest capitalist age. However, this prediction was way off the mark and Polish cinema is now enjoying both critical and commercial success.

The most popular film of recent years was *Bogowie*, (Gods). It focused on the career of Poland's pioneering heart surgeon, Dr Zbigniew Religa, and his battles and

triumphs to establish heart transplant surgery in Poland in the 1970's and 1980's. On paper, it seems like an unlikely story to become such a massive hit but it struck a chord with Polish audiences and there was a certain nostalgia for life in this period. The same producers seem ready to set new records with their latest production, *Sztuka Kochania* (The Art of Love), a biography of Michalina Wisłocka, a Gynaecologist in communist times who published the first manual on sexual health in the 1970's. The hero and heroine of the above films share a number of characteristics. The first was their uncompromising passion for their vocation. The second was that there were driven, flawed and difficult people. Thirdly, they took on the system, not to bring it down, but to bend it sufficiently to change reality.

One of the film directors who managed to successfully operate both with the demands of the communist censor and the commercial priorities of capitalism is the recently deceased, Andrzej Wajda. His final film, *Powidoki*, (Afterimages) is now in cinemas and chronicles the life of a Polish Avant-Garde Artist, Władysław

Strzemiński, and how his artistic perspective was out of line with the Socialist-Realism of the Stalinist era and how he suffered for his art. Many commentators see this film as a statement of resistance by Wajda towards the current trend away from openness and pluralism. Wajda's penultimate film took Lech Wałęsa as the protagonist and explored this charismatic, controversial and complicated character in Polish and World history.

In all these films, we see heroes, warts and all, and it is often the case that these heroes will only be truly valued and appreciated with the passing of time. We all need heroes to look up towards, not to put on a pedestal but to inspire us. I encourage you to explore Polish cinema (Nowe Horyzonty Cinema has many Polish films with English subtitles); certainly a worthwhile escape from the winter that surrounds us.

News from Head of Primary



Have you ever wondered what your child has been doing in their English class? In BISC Primary we pride ourselves in delivering 4 double units of English each week! Those lessons are complemented by a thorough EAL programme, involving the basics of English sounds, grammar and vocabulary. So what does actually a strong Literacy programme involve?

Shared reading is an interactive reading process in which a teacher and student

share in reading a text and the teacher models the skills of a proficient reader. The text is available for both the student and teacher to see.

Read aloud is a process by which teachers select a text to model specific reading strategies often used by readers as they silently read. The process of reading aloud helps to support students' listening comprehension skills as well as reinforce behaviours that readers would use if they are reading independently.

Guided reading allows teachers to create differentiated small groups to deliver reading instruction at a student's particular reading level.

Cloze reading is a strategy in which words are removed from a text to support a student's reading comprehension. Teachers may choose to remove unknown vocabulary words in a passage in order to support a student's ability to use context clues to determine the missing word.

Interactive Writing is a process by which teachers and students share the pen, essentially modelling parts of the writing process. Teachers may model writing a topic sentence for an introductory paragraph and students contribute what is included within the writing.

Dictation has numerous uses in the classroom, often involving a lot of creativity and interest. Used imaginatively, it can be an effective tool for working on accuracy and fluency in pronunciation, listening and spelling.

There are also discussions, presentations and a vast area of creative writing, and many, many more...!

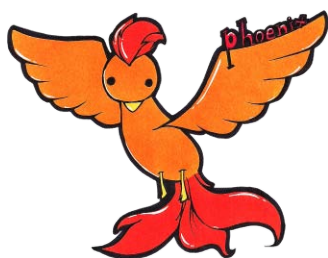
In our class friendship is very important. Despite the weather we managed to have fun and play games both indoor and outdoor.
