In BISC Primary we firmly believe that a responsible student is a successful student. Over the years we have developed a range of strategies to help pupils take care of their needs. I would like to share some of our strategies with you, so you can support us at home:

- We let students help out with small jobs. It builds a sense of togetherness

and care for their learning environment.

- We build in a classroom job system. This is similar to letting students help out, but creates a predictable routine.
- We show students how we want things to look via photographs, visuals or modelling. Once the expectations are clear, it is easier for pupils to succeed.
- We praise them for being responsible positive reinforcement helps pupils understand that their efforts are important and appreciated.
- We have clear consequences that match the lack of responsibility usually it is a "how can you fix it yourself" procedure.
- We talk about it and revisit this concept throughout the year. The more we make it up front and central in students' minds, the more they will realize the importance of it.
- Sometimes we focus on one way to be responsible by challenging them. Hence various neatness class awards and ongoing distribution of merits.


