Dear Parents and visitors to our website,

I trust you all had a pleasant Easter Break and are ready for the demanding term ahead of us. The first thing on the agenda are the parent/teaching meetings which as you are aware take place next week, so I urge you to reserve an appointment by completing the sign-up sheet on the classroom doors (Primary) or in Secondary at the top of the entrance hall stairs in the big villa. Should you be unable to take this opportunity to discuss your child's progress please ensure you make a later mutually convenient appointment to do so.

One of the major life impacting events of yet another cadre of students is a matter of weeks away, namely the external exams session; not only do the results of these decide their progression in further education, for Year 13 it will see the start of a new phase in their lives as they head off to University. It is a stressful time and a time which can be laden with self-doubt. At one point or another, we all question whether or not we are doing enough, making enough money, or if we are going to be "successful" enough, and this can become quite debilitating unless brought under control. Personally I've discovered a few things that help with self-doubt and boost my confidence that may help them too:

### 1. Stop comparing your accomplishments to your

### friends' family and peers' accomplishments.

I find that I doubt myself the most when I'm comparing what I'm doing with what other people are doing. When I compare my accomplishments to a colleague's, I start feeling inadequate. Your colleague's accomplishments are not a litmus test to grade your own success. One key thing to remember when you find yourself in this mental pattern is that everyone is on his or her own journey. I find that I am most successful in my personal and professional life when I am following what works for me and what makes me feel good, even if it is different from what someone I look up to is doing.

### 2. Forget about what everyone else is thinking of you.

When you care about what everyone else is thinking of you, you inhibit yourself. You'd rather do nothing and not get judged than do something and risk criticism. Worrying about what other people think of you will continue to hold you back from doing something potentially huge for yourself. If you hold dreams for your future then at some point you have to let go of everyone else's opinion; otherwise, you'll find yourself in a constant state of self-doubt.

### 3. Just make a decision and then correct your course as you go along.

Getting caught up in a decision is another sure-fire way to water the seeds of self-doubt. It's very easy to get stuck trying to make decisions.

This back-and-forth thought process—questioning if you should go with option A or option B—can exacerbate self-doubt.

What is the cure for this? Just make a decision! Usually your first reaction is going to be your best since it typically comes from a place of intuition rather than the ego, and before outside opinions get in the way.

So to all of us undergoing life-changing events; relax, go with the flow and above all stay positive.

To conclude this week some news and thanks. The news is that the school has a new Head for September, he is highly experienced and will hopefully next week be posting an introduction to himself in the newsletter. Also, Mr. Phil Hart has been appointed Secondary English teacher and advertisements are posted for our two primary vacancies (Ms. Alex informed us on Tuesday that she will return to the U.K.).

On the matter of thanks, this goes to Mrs. Kiml and Mrs. Kidd who have worked tirelessly and most professionally on our school gardens—a task our staff are so grateful for.

This gives you an opportunity to raise also sensitive issues which you would not feel comfortable to raise personally during the Round Table. PTA will communicate your concerns to the school management to make them aware of your concerns and proceed in solving the problems.

To keep the Round Tables more structured, constructive and leading to the solutions of problems, only the announced agenda issues will be addressed during the Round Table with PTA agenda. Therefore, we kindly invite and encourage you to participate in creating this agenda.

Please note that several issues which were raised by parents as problematic have been solved already. For example, (1) the issue of missing lunches has been addressed by introducing a double-check system and a complaint journal, (2) the chain of command (to whom to go when a management member is absent) has been addressed, explained during the Round Table and a clear chart is being created, (3) the school management is making an effort to create a more efficient and more on-time Parent-Teacher conference process. Therefore, let's continue working together to get other problems solved efficiently.

### 2. Gardening project

This week was marked with an active work in seeding the vegetables which will later grow on the school vegetable garden. By this time most of Primary classes and Foundation children have their seeding job behind them. Now thorough following of moisture, warmth and sunlight is expecting our Foundation and Primary children. They are responsible for keeping the soil for plants moist to make sure their seedlings grow strong. During this project Foundation and Primary students learn and repeat about growing the plants from a seed, about the plant structure and about the conditions plants need to thrive. In addition, they get a hands-on gardening experience. So far all children have been very excited and enthusiastic about their gardening project and older Primary students have shown substantial theoretic knowledge about the conditions plants need to grow and thrive. Well done!

As soon as the seedlings grow a bit and reach the top of the "greenhouses" children made, we would highly appreciate parent's help in transplanting the seedling into bigger pots. Children will see the job. However, it's a job which requires very gentle treatment to not damage the young seedlings. For this reasons, we will need helping parents' hands.

Meanwhile, we would kindly ask to supervise your children during the after-school play time to not step on the gardens as the soil has been turned around freshly. The soil needs to keep soft and airy, so children have easier job in planting their plants into their gardens and for the plants to grow well.
