Dear Parents and visitors to our website,

An important announcement is that next week on Thursday and Friday the 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> of June, the school's new Headteacher Mr. Tom McGrath will be visiting. As part of this visit the PTA has kindly arranged a coffee morning at 0900am on Friday, so that if you wish you will have a chance to meet him. Mr. McGrath's visit is a fact-finding exercise which will allow him the opportunity to meet pupils, parents and staff and get familiar with the school in preparation for next September.

As a military historian I will be remembering that 1<sup>st</sup> of July this year is the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Battle of the Somme which turned out to be one of the deadliest battles in history, the Somme came to embody all the horror of the First World War. The Somme became a byword for senseless slaughter as the Allies gained just six miles over 141 days of bloodshed.

The Battle of the Somme was one of the costliest engagements of the First World War. In the summer of 1916 the line of trenches demarcating the Western Front stretched from the English Channel across the length of France to the Swiss border. At Verdun, near the middle of this line, French and German troops were bogged down in a battle of attrition. The objective of the Somme offensive was to relieve the pressure on Verdun and to push the British line forward.

The attack began July 1, 1916 with a predominately British force clambering out of its trenches and crossing No Man's Land under withering German machinegun and artillery fire. The attack soon stalled and deteriorated into disaster. On that day the British suffered almost 60,000 casualties making it the bloodiest day in British military history. Undeterred, the British command ordered the assault to continue the next day with the hope of breaking through the German lines. This attempt and the others that followed through the summer and fall months produced no breakthrough. Finally, with the approach of winter in November, the battle was abandoned. The final tally included 420.000 British casualties, 200,000 French and the Germans 500.000. The reward for this effort was the six-mile movement of the British front line into German territory.

As a tribute to all those that have died in war I thought a poem by my favourite World War one poet would be apt as memorial in remembrance:

Anthem for Doomed Youth by Wilfred Owen:

What passing-bells for these who die as cattle?

- Only the monstrous anger of the guns.

Only the stuttering rifles' rapid rattle Can patter out their hasty orisons. No mockeries now for them; no prayers nor bells:

Nor any voice of mourning save the choirs,— The shrill, demented choirs of wailing shells; And bugles calling for them from sad shires.

What candles may be held to speed them all? Not in the hands of boys, but in their eyes Shall shine the holy glimmers of goodbyes. The pallor of girls' brows shall be their pall; Their flowers the tenderness of patient minds, And each slow dusk a drawing-down of blinds.

#### 1. International Day 2016

International Day 2016 is taking place on June 18, 2016 from 12:00 till 15:00. The International Day will start with an <u>opening</u> <u>ceremony</u> – parade with children entering the school yard behind their national flags. Therefore it's important to be at school on time for the beginning of the program. Children should wear their national costumes or clothes in the colors of their flag for the parade (a small flag fixed on shirt, cap in flag colors, football player's dress of the national team etc.). The parade will be followed by a cultural program. Children will have an opportunity to change for the casual wear before going to bouncing castles and other activities. Please prepare for them casual wear to change if your children will be wearing national costumes or something you don't want them to make dirty.

<u>Food</u> – all families should bring some food typical to their home country to create a food buffet to share with all participants. There is going to be also a Starbucks stall at the venue. Therefore, please think in advance about having smaller value bank notes with you.

<u>Raffle</u> – children will bring home envelopes with numbered tickets in them. Each envelope will contain 2 sets of tickets, each set having 10 tickets. Cost of each set (10 tickets) is 10 PLN. You can buy tickets only in whole sets, only in tens. Tickets have each number in pairs. After purchasing the tickets, one ticket of the same number will serve as entry for each attraction or activity for children, for each plate with cutleries to pick up food and as a raffle entry automatically. The second ticket of the same number you should keep as your reference number for the raffle prize draw. Each ticket used for activities & food will be automatically entered in the raffle draw. The envelopes must be returned to class teachers by next Friday, June 10, either with money enclosed for the tickets or with tickets to return if you are not going to attend International Day or are not interested in purchasing the tickets. There will be an opportunity to buy additional ticket sets also on the day of the event. <u>Raffle Prize Donation</u> – raffle prize donations can be dropped off at Ms.Natalia's, school secretary's office.
