

SUMMER CAMP REGULATIONS

British International School of Wrocław

§ 1 General Provisions

- 1. These regulations define the rules for recruitment, including the selection of participants and the rules for participation in the Summer Camp.
- 2. The organizer of the Summer Camp is the British International School of Cracow we Wrocławiu sp. z o.o. z siedzibą w Krakowie.
- 3. Participation in the Summer Camp is voluntary and paid.

§ 2 Objectives of the Summer Camp

- 1. The main objective of the Summer Camp is the active recreation of children.
- 2. Specific objectives:
 - o Sports activities and games,
 - o Integration of children,
 - o Promoting a healthy lifestyle and active forms of recreation,
 - o Participation in artistic workshops,
 - o Stimulating mental and physical development,
 - o Acquiring new skills English language.

§ 3 Duration, Location, and Method of Conducting the Summer Camp

- 1. The Summer Camp lasts for 2 x 5 days.
- 2. Summer Camp participants are under the supervision of educators for about 6 hours a day, during the hours specified in the general program.
- 3. The Summer Camp is managed by a director.
- 4. The organizer reserves the right to make changes to the program of activities.

§ 4 Conditions for Participation in the Summer Camp

- 1. A child can be a participant of the Summer Camp if: a) The parent/legal guardian completes and submits the qualification form, b) The parent/legal guardian submits a statement confirming that they have read and accepted the contents of the Summer Camp Regulations.
- 2. Parents/guardians are requested to bring and pick up the participants on time.
- 3. Parents/guardians are responsible for the safe journey of the Summer Camp participant to the school building/meeting point. Parents or guardians take full responsibility if the participant returns home alone.
- 4. The parent/legal guardian must inform about any special needs or disorders of the child on the application form.



§ 5 Recruitment

- 1. The recruitment schedule will be announced: a) On the website, b) In the parents' newsletter.
- 2. Interested parents/guardians collect qualification forms from the school's daycare within the specified timeframe.
- 3. The forms are stamped by the organizer and must not be photocopied. Photocopied forms will not be considered in the recruitment process.
- 4. The application form can be filled out by at least one of the parents (legal guardians) of the child being registered.
- 5. A lack of all necessary signatures on the application form disqualifies the child. The responsibility for correctly filling out the form lies with the person completing it.
- 6. If more children apply than there are places available, a recruitment process will be initiated.

§ 6 Rights and Responsibilities of Summer Camp Participants

- 1. The Summer Camp participant has the right to:
 - o Safe, peaceful, and joyful recreation,
 - o Participate in all scheduled activities and trips,
 - Use all facilities and equipment necessary for the implementation of the Summer Camp program,
 - o Address all problems to the educator,
 - o Receive praise and recognition from the educators.
- 2. The Summer Camp participant is obliged to:
 - o Participate in all scheduled activities and trips unless excused by a parent,
 - o Be punctual for all activities,
 - Maintain cleanliness and order and take care of the entrusted property at the place of stay,
 - o Not leave the group without the educator's knowledge,
 - o Behave respectfully towards educators and peers,
 - Follow safety rules and immediately inform the educator or the camp director in case of any life or health threats,
 - o Follow the instructions of the educator and the camp director.
- 3. Non-compliance with the regulations results in, depending on the behavior, a warning, notification of parents, or expulsion from the Summer Camp. Parents are obliged to pick up the child after being informed by the camp director of the situation.
- 4. Parents/guardians are financially responsible for any damages caused by the child.
- 5. The organizer is not responsible for items lost by participants during the camp or for damage to items belonging to children caused by other participants.
- 6. The organizer recommends not bringing valuable items to the camp, such as mobile phones, music players, etc.



\S 7 Rules for Withdrawal from the Summer Camp

- A participant has the right to withdraw from the Summer Camp.
 In case of withdrawal, the parent/legal guardian is obliged to inform the camp director of this
